Minutes of the Regular Meeting of the Board of Trustees

April 28, 2016

The Board of Trustees of the Texas Southmost College District convened in open session on April 28, 2016, at 5:30 p.m., in the Gorgas Board Room at Texas Southmost College. Board members present were Francisco G. Rendon, Chair; Trey Mendez, Vice Chair; Ed Rivera, Secretary; Dr. Reynaldo García; Adela G. Garza; and Art Rendon. Also present was Dr. Lily F. Tercero, President of Texas Southmost College.

1. Call to Order

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Rendon at 5:34 p.m.

2. Speakers to Agenda Items and Public Discussion

There were no speakers.

3. Mission Statement

Chairman Rendon read the mission and role and scope for Texas Southmost College District as follows:

4. President's Report

Chairman Rendon called on Dr. Tercero to give the report. Dr. Tercero announced new employees: Jose Limas, Coordinator of Purchasing, Business Services; Aidee Park, College Transition Specialist, High School Programs and Services and Venancio Rodriguez-Liguez, HVAC Technician, Facilities and Physical Plant.

Dr. Tercero announced that TSC students are holding their annual Bougainvillea Ball, Saturday, April 30^{th} , from 7 p.m. – 11 p.m., at the Jacob Brown Auditorium. She also stated that the Pedal to Padre will be held on Sunday, May 1st, and TSC will be participating in the community event.

Consideration and Approval of the Local Policies as presented

Chairman Rendon called on Dr. Tercero to present the item. She stated that these local policies are recommended revisions by Texas Association of School Boards (TASB), as part of their review to ensure that TSC Policies are aligned with state and/or federal changes, except BBF Ethics which is a new policy. Most of the policy changes are related to the reorganization of the manual in order to align with the new or revised laws.

A motion was made by Mr. Hinojosa to table the item on Adopting the Local Policies as presented. The motion was seconded by Mrs. Garza and carried unanimously. *Exhibit "A"*

7. Consideration and Approval to Authorize the President to Enter into a Consulting Agreement with Texas A&M University's School of Nursing to Enhance TSC's Nursing Program

Consideration and Approval to Authorize the President to Enter into a Consulting Agreement with Texas A&M University's School of Nursing to Enhance TSC's Nursing Program

Chairman Rendon called on Dr. Tercero to present the item. Dr. Tercero stated that when TSC transitioned all existing programs under the oversight of UT Brownsville, a presentation of an overview of these programs was presented to the Board. At the time, it was explained that there were programs in need of further review. Additionally, there were other challenges TSC was going to have to address for some of those programs, such as updated equipment and/or space.

She stated that over the past two years, the TSC Associate Degree Nursing Program (ADN) has been receiving additional support. The equipment had been upgraded and additional learning spaces have been provided. A consultant was engaged to review and provide assistance to the program. Also, faculty members have been working on the alignment of the program's curriculum and have acquired supplemental learning tools.

Dr. Tercero stated that the Texas Board of Nursing, based on state board examination pass rates, has changed the TSC ADN Program status to conditional approval. She said that this agenda item if to seek Board approval to enter into a consulting agreement with the Texas A&M University School of Nursing to continue to work on improving the status of the program.

A motion was made by Dr. García to Approve to Authorize the President to Enter into a Consulting Agreement with Texas A&M University's School of Nursing to Enhance TSC's Nursing Program, as presented. The motion was seconded by Mr. Mendez and carried unanimously.
