A tax rate of \$0.115117 per \$100 valuation has been proposed by the governing body of Texas Southmost College.

The no-new-revenue tax rate is the tax rate for the 2024 tax year that will raise the same amount of property tax revenue for Texas Southmost College from the same properties in both the 2023 tax year and the 2024 tax year.

The voter-approval rate is the highest tax rate that Texas Southmost College may adopt without holding an election to seek voter approval of the rate.

The proposed tax rate is greater than the no-new-revenue tax rate. This means that Texas Southmost College is proposing to increase property taxes for the 2024 tax year.

A PUBLIC HEARING ON THE PROPOSED TAX RATE WILL BE HELD ON August 22, 2024 AT 5:30 PM AT GORGAS BOARD ROOM, 80 FORT BROWN, BROWNSVILLE, TX 78520.

The proposed tax rate is not greater than the voter-approval tax rate. As a result, Texas Southmost College is not required to hold an election at which voters may accept or reject the proposed tax rate. However, you may express your support for or opposition to the proposed tax rate by contacting the members of the TEXAS SOUTHMOST COLLEGE of Texas Southmost College at their offices or by attending the public hearing mentioned above.

The 86th Texas Legislature modified the manner in which the voter-approval tax rate is calculated to limit the rate of growth of property taxes in the state.
